H2084: VOTER REGISTRATION RECORDS; DEATH RECORDS

The Department of Health Services is required to annually provide to the Secretary of State without charge a record of all deaths of Arizona residents that are reported to the Dept. using the statewide electronic death registration system. The records transmitted by the Dept. must include only specified information on the decedent. The Secretary of State may compare the records of deaths with the statewide voter registration database. H2114: INDEPENDENT BUSINESS STATUS; DECLARATION

Any employing unit contracting with an independent contractor may prove the existence of an independent contractor relationship for the purposes of Title 23 (Labor) by the independent contractor executing a declaration of independent business status. Establishes a form for the declaration of independent business status, and requires the declaration to be signed by the independent contractor and

dated. A declaration in compliance with these requirements creates a rebuttable presumption of an independent contractor relationship. The execution of a declaration of independent business status in compliance with these requirements is not mandatory in order to establish the existence of an independent contractor relationship. Except for the enforcement of occupational safety and health regulations, any supervision or control exercised by an employing unit to comply with any statute, rule or code adopted by the federal government, the state or a political subdivision or any requirement of licensing, professional or ethical standards cannot be considered for the purposes of determining the independent contractor or employment status of any relationship. H2291: GROUNDWATER; WATERLOGGED AREA EXEMPTION; DATE

The exemption from any irrigation water duties or intermediate water duties for a person with an irrigation grandfathered right on irrigation acres in the management plans for the first through fourth management periods for the Phoenix Active Management Area (AMA) is extended to the fifth management period and terminates on December 31, 2024. The exemption from conservation requirements for the distribution of groundwater for specified companies and districts is also extended to the fifth management period for the Phoenix AMA and terminates on December 31, 2024. The exemption from groundwater withdrawal fees and water quality assurance fees for these areas is extended five years through 2024, from 2019. AS SIGNED BY GOVERNOR.

H2307: ANATOMICAL GIFTS; PROCUREMENT ORGANIZATIONS; LICENSURE

A person is prohibited from acting as an anatomical gift procurement organization in Arizona unless the person is licensed by the Department of Health Services. Some exceptions. Requirements for licensure are established, including a requirement for the organization to pay all applicable fees as prescribed by the Dept. and requirements for documentation and record-keeping. The Dept. is authorized to take various enforcement actions against a licensee in violation of statutory requirements and related rules adopted by the Dept. The Dept. is required to issue a license to a procurement organization that is accredited by a nationally recognized accrediting agency, and a procurement organization that is licensed by virtue of being accredited is exempt from certain statutory requirements. H2325: ENVIRONMENT; WATER QUALITY AMENDMENTS

Various changes to statutes relating to water quality. The maximum lead content for pipes, pipe fittings, and plumbing fittings and fixtures is set at a weighted average of 0.25 percent when used with respect to wetted surfaces, and must be calculated using a specified formula. The list of exemptions from the maximum lead content standards is expanded to include specified uses where water is not anticipated to be used for human consumption. Monies from fees for certification of operators of potable water systems and sewage treatment plants are deposited in the Water Quality Fee Fund, instead of the general fund. AS SIGNED BY GOVERNOR.

H2337: REGULATION; DEFICIENCIES; OPPORTUNITY TO CORRECT

When deficiencies are identified during an inspection and the agency is unsure whether a regulated person meets the statutory list of circumstances which preclude the person from receiving an opportunity to correct the deficiencies, the agency is required to provide the regulated person with an opportunity to correct. H2391: MUNICIPALITIES; WATER RATES; REQUIREMENTS

Municipalities are prohibited from assessing or collecting a fee on new water or wastewater service connections at the time of the establishment of service to those connections for the purpose of recovering the municipality's costs of acquiring the utility plan, facilities, system or other property of a public service corporation or another municipality engaged in the business of providing water or wastewater service. Does not apply to water or wastewater fees adopted before January 1, 2016 or included in a notice of intent to adopt or increase rates and fees adopted before January 1, 2016. AS SIGNED BY GOVERNOR.

H2475: FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENTS; PROCUREMENT ORGANIZATIONS

It is a class 2 (mid-level) misdemeanor for a funeral director or embalmer or an agent of a funeral director or embalmer to hold a direct pecuniary or proprietary interest in an organ "procurement organization" (defined elsewhere in statute). Some exceptions. It is a class 2 (mid-level) misdemeanor for a funeral establishment owner or operator to influence employees of the funeral establishment to direct human remains to a procurement organization in which the owner or operator has a direct pecuniary or proprietary interest. It is a class 2 (mid-level)

misdemeanor for a funeral establishment and a procurement organization to operate on the same premises. AS SIGNED BY GOVERNOR.

H2613: REGULATORY BOARDS; LICENSING; REVISIONS

Eliminates state licensing for assayers and citrus fruit packers. Requires the Board of Technical Registration to grant assayer emeritus status to an assayer who is registered by the Board on the effective date of this legislation if the assayer has not received any complaints during active registration and the assayer analyzes metals, ores, minerals or alloys to ascertain the quantity of any substance in those items. Effective January 1, 2017, eliminates state licensing for professional driver training school instructors. The Department of Transportation is required to adopt rules to establish requirements and minimum standards for commercial motor vehicle instructors by December 31, 2016. Permits a "trained geologist" (defined) to engage in a geological practice without being registered by the Board, except under specified conditions, and allows the State Geologist to be a trained geologist. A responsible cremationist is required to be licensed by the Board. Any other cremationist is permitted, instead of required, to be licensed, and, if not licensed, is authorized to engage only in cremation activity that is allowed without a license. Retroactive to July 1, 2016, the list of exemptions from licensure as a private vocational program is expanded to include a yoga teacher training course or program or a yoga instructional course or program. The Department of Administration is required to conduct a study relating to the transfer of all nonhealth regulatory boards in Title 32 (Professions and Occupations) to a new licensing and regulatory division in the Dept. and to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the Legislature by September 1, 2016. The list of special taxing districts where a majority of the real property owners in the district may petition the district board to apportion the tax among the lots in the district according to the area in square feet of each lot is expanded to include domestic wastewater improvement districts. In a domestic water improvement district or domestic wastewater improvement district that assesses and levies its taxes based on the square footage of the property, the governing body of the district in its discretion is authorized to establish by resolution a limit on the amount of tax that may be assessed and collected by the district from any single parcel of real property in the district. S1104: MEDICAL EXAMINER; JURISDICTION; DEATH REPORTING

The list of deaths of a human being that require prompt notification of a peace officer and that require a death investigation by the county medical examiner or alternate medical examiner is modified to include unexpected or unexplained death of an infant or child and to remove death from disease or accident believed to be related to the deceased's occupation or employment. Also, death of a "person in a custodial agency" (defined elsewhere in statute) replaces death occurring in a prison and death of a prisoner. AS SIGNED BY GOVERNOR.

The Department of Water Resources would no longer have been required to give written notice of county adequate water supply ordinances to the mayors of all municipalities in the county, and municipalities that received the notice would no longer have been required to comply with specified county adequate water supply requirements. A municipality that received a notice from the Dept. before the effective date of this act would have been required to comply with county adequate water supply requirements unless the legislative body of the municipality adopted an ordinance after the effective date of this act that provided that the municipality would not be subject to the requirements. The legislative body of a municipality with a population of more than 25,000 persons would have been authorized to adopt a municipal adequate water supply ordinance only if a list of specified conditions

applied, including that the municipality was participating in a program to augment the aquifer underlying the municipality, the municipality had adopted a plan for the reuse of reclaimed water, and the municipality had adopted a residential and nonresidential water conservation program. S1270: PEST MANAGEMENT DIVISION

Responsibility for regulating pest management and pest management services is transferred to the newly established Pest Management Division in the Department of Agriculture, and the Office of Pest Management is repealed. Pest management statutes are transferred and renumbered. S1413: FIDUCIARY ACCESS TO DIGITAL ASSETS

Adds a new chapter to Title 14 (Trusts and Estates) entitled the Revised Uniform

Fiduciary Access to Digital Assets Act. Establishes a procedure for disclosing digital assets and for disclosing content of electronic communications and other digital assets of a deceased user or a principal. Also establishes requirements for disclosure of digital assets held in trust both when the trustee is the original user and when the trustee is not the original user. The legal duties imposed on a fiduciary charged with managing tangible property apply to the management of digital assets. A custodian and its officers, employees and agents are immune from liability for an act or omission done in good faith in compliance with this legislation. AS SIGNED BY GOVERNOR.
