52nd Arizona Legislature - First Regular Session Legislative Report

The First Regular Session of the 52nd Arizona Legislature adjourned sine die on Friday, April 3, 2015 at 3:37 a.m. The session lasted 81 days, the shortest session since 1968. Legislative sessions have typically lasted an average of 125 days so the length of the session was one for the record books. From the beginning days of the legislative session Governor Ducey, President Biggs and Speaker Gowan worked in private to negotiate a budget deal. They were faced with finding a solution to the State's \$1.5 billion dollar budget shortfall. The result of the negotiations was a lean \$9.1 billion dollar budget that was passed and signed in early March. The budget package hit the education community hard with universities budgets being cut by 99 million dollars. Governor Ducey indicated that the cuts were hard but necessary to address the State's financial crisis. The Governor stated the budget cuts contained in the FY 2016 budget will put the State on track to make the budget structurally sound by 2018 without having to raise taxes. However, an important factor looming over the Legislature and future budgets is in the outcome of the lawsuit relating to education funding. A court decision could certainly have a major impact on future budgets.
