It is unlawful for a person to sell or use the pesticides clothianidin, imidacloprid or thiamethoxam in Arizona. First sponsor: Rep. Mendez

H2291: GROUNDWATER; WATERLOGGED AREA EXEMPTION; DATE

The exemption from any irrigation water duties or intermediate water duties for a person with an irrigation grandfathered right on irrigation acres in the management plans for the first through fourth management periods for the Phoenix Active Management Area (AMA) is extended to the fifth management period and terminates on December 31, 2024. The exemption from conservation requirements for the distribution of groundwater for specified companies and districts is also extended to the fifth management period for the Phoenix AMA and terminates on December 31, 2024. The exemption from groundwater withdrawal fees and water quality assurance fees for these areas is extended five years through 2024, from 2019.

H2307: ANATOMICAL GIFTS; PROCUREMENT ORGANIZATIONS; LICENSURE

A person acting as an anatomical gift procurement organization in Arizona is required to be licensed by the Department of Health Services and pay all applicable license fees as prescribed by the Dept. Requirements for licensure and record keeping are established. The Dept is authorized to take various enforcement actions against a licensee in violation of statutory requirements and related rules adopted by the Dept.

The board of directors of a multi-county water conservation district is required to include one nonvoting member who is appointed by the Governor from a list of three persons holding elected tribal office for an Indian tribe in Arizona. This member serves a four-year term or until s/he is no longer holding an elected tribal office, whichever occurs earlier. The initial term of this member begins on January 1, 2017.

H2325: ENVIRONMENT; WATER QUALITY AMENDMENTS

Various changes to statutes relating to water quality. The maximum lead content for pipes, pipe fittings, and plumbing fittings and fixtures is set at a weighted average of 0.25 percent when used with respect to wetted surfaces, and must be calculated using a specified formula. The list of exemptions from the maximum lead content standards is expanded to include specified uses where water is not anticipated to be used for human consumption. Monies from fees for certification of operators of potable water systems and sewage treatment plants are deposited in the Water Quality Fee Fund, instead of the general fund. First sponsor: Rep. Every fee or service charge demanded or received by municipalities for water and wastewater services is required to be attributable to and defray or cover the expense of service for which the fee or service charge is assessed. A fee or charge may not be assessed or collected for the purpose of defraying or covering the municipality's cost of purchasing or otherwise acquiring a water or wastewater corporation or business. Any water or wastewater rate, rate component, fee or service charge assessed to fund new infrastructure or capital improvements is required to comply with statute regulating municipal development fees. H2613: REGULATORY BOARDS; LICENSING; REVISIONS

Eliminates state licensing for assayers, geologists, landscape architects, cremationists, professional driver training school instructors, athletic trainers, and citrus fruit packers. A person is permitted to practice athletic training in Arizona if the person operates under the supervision of a licensed physician and is certified by a national accredited athletic training program. Repeals the Board of Athletic Training. A person is prohibited from using the words "professional geologist" or "professional landscape architect" unless the person has either a valid certificate of qualification in that field that is issued by a national bureau of registration or certification or a degree or certificate from an accredited educational institution in that field. Removes a landscape architect and a geologist or assayer from the Board of Technical Registration and replaces them with two addition public members. The Department of Administration is required to conduct a study relating to the transfer of all non-health regulatory boards in Title 32 (Professions and Occupations) to a new licensing and regulatory division in the Dept, and to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the Legislature by October 1, 2016. Due to voter protection, one section of this legislation containing technical and conforming changes only requires the affirmative vote of at least 3/4 of the members of each house of the Legislature for passage.

The list of special taxing districts where a majority of the real property owners in the district may petition the district board to apportion the tax among the lots in the district according to the area in square feet of each lot is expanded to include domestic wastewater improvement districts. In a domestic water improvement district or domestic wastewater improvement district that assesses and levies its taxes based on the square footage of the property, the governing body of the district in its discretion is authorized to establish by resolution a limit on the amount of tax that may be assessed and collected by the district from any single parcel of real property in the district. The 2016 general election ballot is to carry the question of whether to amend the state Constitution to prohibit the Legislature from levying a tax on the first \$2.4 million of full cash value of personal property that is initially acquired during or after tax year 2016 and that is used for agricultural purposes or in trade or business. The Legislature is permitted to provide by law for increasing \$2.4 million exempt amount.

Adds a new article to Title 48 (Special Taxing Districts) establishing and regulating water and energy improvement districts. The governing body of a local government is authorized to adopt a resolution establishing a district after following specified steps. Once a district is formed, the local government is authorized to hire a program administrator and staff, contract for professional services, impose fees and assessments to offset the costs of administering a program, and issue bonds or notes to finance qualified projects. The list of bodies of water exempt from the prohibition on using any water to fill or refill all or a portion of a body of water is expanded to include a body of water within the boundaries of the exempted area delineated on the map of the Phoenix Active Management Area filed with the Secretary of State's office and the body of water meets all of a list of specified requirements, including that the body of water is established as the result of aggregate mining. The Department of Water Resources is no longer required to give written notice of county adequate water supply ordinances to the mayors of all municipalities in the county, and municipalities that receive the notice are no longer required to comply with specified adequate water supply requirements. Applies to any municipality that received a notice from the Dept before the effective date of this act that the county in which the municipality is located enacted an adequate water supply ordinance affecting the municipality, and those municipalities are no longer bound by that county's adequate water supply ordinance. Does not apply to any municipality that adopts its own adequate water supply ordinance before, on or after the effective date of this act.

Responsibility for regulating pest management and pest management services is transferred to the newly established Pest Management Division in the Department of Agriculture, and the Office of Pest Management is repealed. Pest management statutes are transferred and renumbered. The Pest Management Fund is renamed the Pest Management Trust Fund, and the Fund is no longer required to deposit 10 percent of revenues in the general fund. The Pest Management Advisory Committee is renamed the Pest Management Division Council, and additional requirements for the Council are specified. Retroactive to July 1, 2016.

S1334: STATE EMPLOYEES; MEET AND CONFER

State agencies and departments are recognized as the sole and exclusive authority with respect to determining the manner in which that entity's activities are conducted and administered. Department employees cannot engage in a sickout, work slowdown or strike. The recognized employee organization and any state department are required to meet and confer on a regular basis, at least once every 2 years, to discuss employment conditions. If an agreement is reached, it must be submitted to the Governor for consideration, and the final decision by the Governor is binding.

A seller or solicitor is prohibited from initiating an outbound telephone solicitation call to any telephone number on the national do-not-call registry, instead of an intrastate call to any telephone number in Arizona. County boards of supervisors are permitted to establish a program to allow persons to make gifts, grants or donations for the purpose of providing financial assistance to qualified owners of residential real property for making improvements to an existing drinking water well or providing for a water delivery system for the residence. The board is required to designate an entity to operate the program. Program requirements are specified. First sponsor: Sen. Griffin

Sections of the state Constitution relating to property tax exemptions are repealed and replaced. Impossible to determine new provisions without a line by line comparison.
