Prior to death, a decedent may direct in writing the disposition of his/her remains and specify funeral goods and services to be provided. These instructions may not be changed in any material way, except if required by law, and must be carried out on the decedent's death if the instructions are clear and complete, arrangements for payment have been made, and the instructions do not violate the written policies of the funeral establishment, crematory or cemetery. H2142: WATER INFRASTRUCTURE FINANCE AUTHORITY; PREPAYMENT

For financial assistance from the clean water revolving fund or drinking water revolving fund, the Water Infrastructure Finance Authority (WIFA) is prohibited from unilaterally amending the financial assistance agreement, loan or bond after its execution. WIFA is prohibited from imposing a redemption premium as a condition of refinancing or receiving prepayment on a financial assistance agreement, loan or bond if the agreement, loan or bond did not contain a redemption premium. Applies to all financial assistance agreements, loans or bonds issued or executed by WIFA before or after the effective date of this legislation.

H2212: LICENSING; ACCOUNTABILITY; ENFORCEMENT; EXCEEDING REGULATION

Statute prohibiting municipalities, counties, special taxing districts and state agencies from basing licensing decisions on requirements or conditions that are not specifically authorized by statute, rule, ordinance or code may be enforced in a private civil action and relief may be awarded against a municipality, county, special taxing district or the state. The court is required to award reasonable attorney fees, costs, damages and license application fees to a party that prevails in an action against the municipality, county, special taxing district or state. A municipal, county, special taxing district or state employee is prohibited from participating in violations of the statute. H2263: EMERGENCY GROUNDWATER TRANSPORTATION; COLORADO RIVER

Groundwater that is withdrawn in a groundwater basin or sub-basin that is outside of an initial active management area (AMA) and that is adjacent or reasonably accessible to the Central Arizona Project canal system may be transported to an initial AMA if the AMA is at significant risk of forced reductions in deliveries of Colorado River water and the Governor issues a formal declaration of Colorado River water shortage emergency.

H2361: ASSURED WATER SUPPLY; ALT CERTIFICATE

The owner of land that has qualified as member land in a water conservation district and for which the Department of Water Resources has issued a certificate of assured water supply is authorized to apply to the Dept for a reissued certificate of assured water supply that is not based on the land qualifying as member land in the district. The Dept is required to grant the application if it determines that a list of specified conditions apply.

Beginning with the fall semester of 2015, the Arizona Board of Regents is required to establish a Post-9/11 Veteran Education Relief Program to provide tuition grants to "qualifying military veterans" (defined) who are pursuing a first baccalaureate degree at a university under the jurisdiction of ABOR after the benefits under the federal Post-9/11 Veterans Educational Assistance Act of 2008 are no longer available. Program requirements are specified, and the Program terminates on July 1, 2025. Each calendar quarter, 40 percent of any balance in the Military Family Relief Fund is transferred to ABOR for the Program, and 10 percent must be distributed to entities that operate cemeteries in Arizona for military veterans. H2660: DOMESTIC WATER IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS; DIRECTORS

The county board of supervisors is required to make an order calling an election to decide whether to reorganize a domestic water improvement district with a district board consisting of three members as a district with a board consisting of five members when a petition containing the signatures of 25 percent of the qualified voters residing in the district is filed with the board. The election may be held on any consolidated election date, and the district is required to reimburse the county for the expenses of the district election.
